Changing the batteries in your transceiver is always a good idea. Batteries can wear out over the summer and corrosion can build up in the battery case. Making sure both the batteries and connection are fresh and clean is necessary to ensure your transceiver is working properly. Other pieces of equipment to check before heading into the backcountry include your shovel and probe. It's surprising how easily the closet monster can damage these seemingly durable pieces of equipment. It only takes a few minutes to put these items together to make sure they are functioning properly.
